Spotlight on..... Lee Ann Larson, PGG, PSP

What does PSP mean? It is a title that is rarely heard. One is PA is Mrs. Lee Ann Larson of Bethel #12 Gettysburg. Mrs. Larson was a member of Bethel #4 Alexandria, Virginia and held several stations, including Marshal, Guide, Junior Princess, and Senior Princess.

She went no further since she wanted to attend college at Penn State University. So she is a "PSP"- Past Senior Princess. Upon graduating from college she moved to Gettysburg, where with the help of several Eastern Star Sisters, she organized Bethel

#12 in 1961 and served as its first Bethel Guardian. Lee Ann's father served as Associate Supreme Guardian in 1964-65, after serving as associate Bethel Guardian of Bethel #4, and Associate Grand Guardian of VA. Lee Ann's father installed her as Grand Guardian

of PA in June of 1965, and Mary Etta Wright served as the Supreme Guardian during the same time period. As Grand Guardian Mrs. Larson constituted Bethel #15 in Elizabethtown and instituted Bethel #16 in Chambersburg.

All 16 Bethels were active at that time and held their Grand Visits on a Saturday or Sunday. Her session was held at the Gettysburg College in June of 1966. She was appointed Supreme Fifth Messenger for the 1967-68 Supreme Council. Mrs. Larson is still active at Bethel #12 Gettysburg and encourages all Majority Members to continue their Job's Daughters life by working with their Bethels or by starting new ones in other areas.

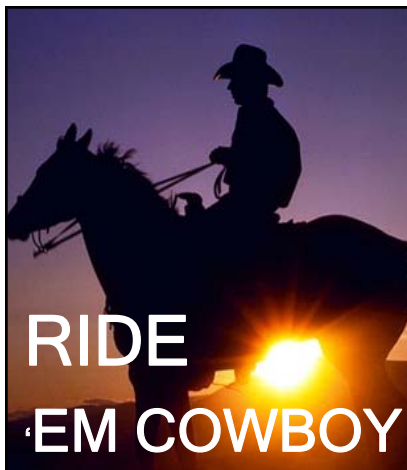

Collecting Stamps for Order of Eastern Star



Do you like to recycle? Do something good for others? Do some Masonic Service?

Well here is a way that you can do all three....

CUT AND CLIP for Charity.

The Pennsylvania Easter Star, collects stamps and through this they are able to raise monies for charities and others.

Can you and even your Bethel contribute to this cause? Yes, by clipping off stamps that you receive in the mail. Believe it or not, they can make a difference.

Here is a little back ground on what OES has done in the past and how with your help, they can do even more for others.

Just cut and clip your stamps and bring them to Grand Bethel Weekends. These stamps will then be presented to OES for their Fraternal charity which assists members in need.

You can make a difference!

While you are doing this you can also earn Masonic Service hours by clipping them for use.

Stamps were collected across Pennsylvania in 2008-09 totaled 2,011 pounds. These stamps were sold to a company which processes them selling them to Collectors and Dealers. The stamps are sorted into four classifications: Commemorative, Hi-value, Foreign, and others. Commemorative stamps reflect

people, places and things. A person must be dead greater than five years and nominated to be on the stamp. Hi-value stamps are greater than \$.44. Foreign stamps do not say U.S.A. and has the name of a Foreign country or Great Britain. The charity to receive the money is selected by the Worthy Grand Matron. This past year the money sent to MS (Multiple Sclerosis). Other years it has gone to Educational Scholarship, Fraternal, Youth, etc

When cutting stamps, leave 1/4 inch around the stamp. Do not cut the tear off portion on the stamp. Contact Lana Karl for more information.
